Chapter 123.

CHAP. 123.

An act to amend section one hundred and five of chapter eighty-two of the revised statutes, relating to proceedings in court.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Section one hundred and five of chapter eighty-two of the revised statutes, is hereby amended by adding thereto, at its close, the following words: *and in case proceedings in any action shall be stayed, as provided in this section, the defendant shall have, and may maintain an action on the case against the assignee for his costs up to the time when proceedings are so stayed.*

In case action be stayed in suit of assignee in name of assignor, deft. may maintain action for costs.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

Chapter 124.

An act additional to chapter eighteen of the revised statutes, relating to ways.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The municipal officers of a town may lay out a way as provided in section eighteen of chapter eighteen of the revised statutes, for the purposes of hauling wood or lumber, and to be used only when the ground is so covered with snow that such hauling shall not in any way tear up or break the soil underneath such way.

Municipal officers may lay out a way for hauling wood or lumber.

SECT. 2. When so laid out, such municipal officers shall state in their return the purposes for which such road is laid, and that the same shall be used only during the winter season, and shall in their return, order the person or persons for whose accommodation such road is laid out, to pay into the town treasury wherein such road is located, an amount equal to the damages and expenses of such location, for the benefit of the owner of the land over which such way is laid, and such road shall not be accepted by the town until such amount is so paid.

Return of location.

SECT. 3. No town shall be liable for any damage to any person travelling or in any way going upon such way.

Town not liable for damages.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.
