of real and personal estate may do ; and are also authorized to manufacture in the county of Penobscot, lumber, flour and meal, and fabrics of wood, wool, cotton, iron and steel, paper, leather, or other materials.

SECT. 2. Said corporation shall have its office or place of general business, in the town of Newport ; shall have authority to exercise any of the powers conferred by this act or other laws of this state, when ten thousand dollars of the capital stock shall be taken and paid for ; shall have authority to make all necessary regulations and by-laws for transacting the business of the corporation, not repugnant to the laws of this state.

SECT. 3. Any two of the first three persons named in this act may call the first meeting of this corporation by causing written notices, by them signed, of the time and place of meeting to be given to each of the other corporators, seven days at least, prior to the meeting ; and six of said corporators shall make a quorum for said first meeting.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

Chapter 190.

An act to regulate the taking of fish in the Damariscotta river.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. No person shall be allowed during the months of December, January, February and March of each year, to take fish by the use of nets or seines from the Damariscotta river and its tributaries, so far up said river as the tide waters extend.

SECT. 2. If any person shall take fish from said river or its tributaries in violation of the provisions of this act, he shall forfeit and pay a penalty of fifty dollars for each offence ; one half to the use of the state, and the other half to the use of the person prosecuting therefor.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.
