Chapter 206.

An act to make valid the doings of the town officers of tho town of Baldwin.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The doings of the assessors of the town of Baldwin for the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, in assessing and committing all sums of money raised by and apportioned to said town as taxes for said year, are hereby declared and made valid and sufficient in law, notwithstanding any errors or omissions of said assessors in committing said taxes for collection.

Sect. 2. The acts of such person as was chosen collector of Baldwin for the year aforesaid, and to whom the tax bills of said town for said year were intrusted for collection, in collecting so much of said bills as by him has been collected, are hereby declared and made valid and sufficient in law, notwithstanding any errors or omissions by the assessors in the commitments for that year, or absence of collector's bond.

The assessors of the town of Baldwin for the time be-**Sect.** 3. ing, are hereby fully authorized to make such abatements in the taxes of said town for the year eighteen hundred and sixty-three, as they may deem proper, to correct any clerical errors, and to commit by warrant in due form of law all unpaid tax bills not so abated, for the year eighteen hundred and sixty-three, to any constable or collector of the town of Baldwin for collection.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

Approved January 31, 1867.

Assessors may abate taxes for said year, correct errors and recommit for collection.
