manufacture of which is not prohibited by the laws of this state, and to deal in or sell the same there or elsewhere, to erect, own or lease such buildings and machinery as may be necessary, and to purchase and hold such personal and real estate as may be deemed proper in the prosecution of its business, with power to lease, or sell and convey, or otherwise dispose of and manage the same; also, to make such by-laws and establish such rules and regulations for the management and government of said corporation as may be deemed necessary and proper.

CHAP. 211.

Government.

SECT. 3. Said corporation shall have a capital stock of one hundred thousand dollars, with liberty to increase the same from time to time, by a majority vote of the stockholders, at any meeting duly called for that purpose, to a sum not exceeding two hundred thousand dollars, which stock shall be divided into shares of one hundred dollars each.

Capital.

SECT. 4. James R. Clark, one of the corporators named in this act, may call the first meeting of said corporation by giving one weeks' notice in any newspaper published in said Biddeford.

Organization

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

Chapter 211.

An act to authorize Sidney R. Smith and others to erect fish-weirs in the Carrying Place Cove in Lubec.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Sidney R. Smith, Edward N. Myers, E. Adams Davis and Edward L. Joy, and their successors, are hereby authorized to erect and maintain fish-weirs in the waters of the Bay of Fundy, in the Carrying Place Cove in Lubec; *provided* that no weir or weirs shall be erected within the limits of said cove, except according to the provisions of this act, nor shall any weir or other obstruction to the navigation of said cove be placed within the distance of fifty rods outside of the entrance of said cove except by the persons named in this act.
