Chapter 268.

CHAP. 268.

An act to amend former acts to set off certain lands from the town of Frankfort and annex the same to the town of Monroe.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The third section of an act entitled "an act additional to an act to set off certain lands from the town of Frankfort and annex the same to the town of Monroe," approved March twenty-first, eighteen hundred and sixty-four, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "forty," in the third line, the word *seven*, so that as amended the valuation of the town of Monroe shall be established at two hundred forty-seven thousand nine hundred fifty-three dollars.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

Chapter 269.

An act to incorporate the West Bangor and Hermon Mutual Fire Insurance Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The West Bangor and Hermon Mutual Fire Insurance Company, a voluntary association now existing in West Bangor and the town of Hermon, for the purpose of insuring the property of its members against loss by fire, is hereby created a body politic and corporate by the same name, with its present constitution and by-laws, and shall have such powers and privileges and be subject to such duties and liabilities as are granted and prescribed by the general laws of this state relating to corporations.

SECT. 2. The authority of said company to effect insurance shall be limited to and within the town of Hermon, and so much of the territory of Bangor as pertains to the front tier of lots lying upon either side of the Carmel Road from the east line of Eleazer Crowell's farm in said Bangor, westerly to the east line of the town of Hermon.

SECT. 3. This act may be accepted at any regular meeting of said association by a majority of the members present, and shall take effect from and after its approval by the governor.
