Chapter 272.

An act to make valid the doings of the plantation of Van Buren.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. All acts and proceedings authorized by law which Doings at were done and performed by the inhabitants of the plantation of plantation Van Buren, in the county of Aroostook, at their annual plantation 1865 and 1866, meetings for the years eighteen hundred and sixty-five and eighteen hundred and sixty-six, are hereby made valid; and the records of said plantation are hereby made legal evidence of the doings of said inhabitants at said annual meetings.

SECT. 2. The doings of the selectmen and of the assessors of the said plantation of Van Buren for the said years of eighteen hun- officers in dred sixty-five and eighteen hundred sixty-six, in assessing and &c., made committing all sums of money raised by and apportioned to said plantation as taxes for said years, are hereby declared to be valid and sufficient in law.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

Chapter 273.

An act to incorporate the Narraganset Manufacturing and Trading Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Humphrey Cousens, Roscoe G. Harding, John A. Corporators. Waterman, Josiah B. Webb, Stephen Hinkley junior, Albion P. Files and Frederick Robie, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate by the name of Narraganset Manufacturing and Trading Company, with power Powers of same. to adopt a common seal, to sue and be sued, to hold real and personal estate, and to lease, sell and convey, and otherwise dispose of the same, adopt a code of by-laws not inconsistent with the laws of the state, and to do and perform such acts and things as may be necessary for the successful prosecution of the business of said company.

SECT. 2. Said company is authorized to manufacture, in the Purpose. town of Gorham, wood, brick, leather, or any article not prohibited by the laws of this state, and to engage in a general mercantile business.
