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PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE.

1867.

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SECT. 3. An act entitled "an act to limit the jurisdiction of the city of Biddeford," approved March tenth, eighteen hundred and sixty-two, is hereby amended in the fourth line of section one, by striking out the words "has his residence," and inserting instead thereof the words, *resides or is commorant*.

SECT. 4. All writs and processes issued before this act takes effect, returnable to said court, may be prosecuted to final judgment, and executions thereon issued, the same and with the same effect as if this act had not passed.

Cases not  
affected.

SECT. 5. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

Acts inconsis-  
tent repealed.

SECT. 6. This act shall take effect and be in force in thirty days after its approval by the governor.

### Chapter 289.

An act to incorporate the Quantabacook Water Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECT. 1. That J. B. Coffin, E. P. Dorman, H. W. Ramsdell, their associates and successors, are hereby incorporated and made a body politic, by the name of Quantabacook Water Company, and for the purposes herein mentioned.

Corporators.

SECT. 2. Said company is hereby authorized to construct one or more aqueducts from the Quantabacook spring to the village of Harrington.

Purpose and  
location.

SECT. 3. Said company is hereby authorized to cross the county road at suitable places, also to cross the Great Marsh stream above and near upper bridge, and below and near the lower bridge.

Crossings.

SECT. 4. Said corporation may hold real and personal property to the amount of twenty thousand dollars in value, and shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties and liabilities of similar corporations as defined by the laws of the state.

Capital, powers  
and duties.

SECT. 5. The first meeting of the company may be called by any two of the corporation, in such manner as they think proper.

Organization.
