Chapter 305.

CHAP. 305.

An act to incorporate the Shapleigh and Acton Agricultural Society.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Alfred Hull, Enoch W. Bodwell, Ivory Bragdon, Edmund Goodwin, Edwin A. Moulton, Eleazer Thing, Horace Bodwell, John Lord, Ivory Goodwin, Cyrus Grant, Stephen Lary and Joshua B. Sanborn, together with such other persons as may join them, are hereby incorporated an agricultural society, to be known by the name of the Shapleigh and Acton Agricultural Society, with power by that name to prosecute and defend suits at law.

Corporators.

Name and Powers.

SECT. 2. Said society is hereby established within the towns of Shapleigh and Acton, in the county of York, with power to make by-laws and regulations for the management of their affairs not repugnant to the laws of the state, to take and hold property, real and personal, the annual income of which shall not exceed one thousand dollars, to be applied to the advancement of agriculture and mechanic arts within the said towns of Shapleigh and Acton.

Location.

Purpose.

SECT. 3. Said society shall be under the same obligations and be entitled to the powers and privileges usually granted to similar societies.

Obligations and privileges.

SECT. 4. Alfred Hull and Enoch W. Bodwell are hereby authorized to call the first meeting of said society, by giving seven days previously to each member a written or verbal notice of the time and place of holding the aforesaid meeting.

Organization.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

Chapter 306.

An act granting certain powers to the Baptist Society, in Berwick.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The Baptist Society in Berwick is authorized to sell and convey any and all its interest in real estate, and appropriate the proceeds thereof to the support of the minister or ministers who shall be hereafter settled over said society.

Sale of estate authorized and appropriation of proceeds regulated.

SECT. 2. All acts and proceedings of said society done and had for the purpose of continuing its organization under the charter granted by the general court of Massachusetts, dated February twenty-second, seventeen hundred and ninety-six, are hereby declared valid for the purposes aforesaid.

Acts for continuance of organization made valid.

CHAP. 307. SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

Chapter 307.

An act to incorporate the Casco Mills.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

- Corporators.** SECT. 1. Josiah Bardwell, Benjamin E. Bates and Edmund Dwight, their associates, successors and assigns, are constituted and made a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Casco Mills, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties and liabilities provided by the laws of this state concerning manufacturing corporations.
- Powers and duties.**
- Purpose.** SECT. 2. Said corporation is authorized to manufacture cotton, wool and flax in the city of Lewiston, to purchase and hold real and personal estate not exceeding one million dollars in value, to build and erect such buildings and machinery as their convenience may require, and make all necessary rules and regulations for the prosecution of the same consistent with the laws of this state.

- Organization.** SECT. 3. Josiah Bardwell is hereby authorized to call the first meeting of these corporators, by giving to each of the others a written notice of the same seven days before such meeting.
- SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

Chapter 308.

An act to incorporate the Lockwood Mills.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

- Corporators.** SECT. 1. Benj. E. Bates, Nathaniel Walker, and Josiah Bardwell, their associates, successors and assigns, are constituted and made a body politic and corporate by the name of the Lockwood Mills, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties and liabilities provided by the laws of this state concerning manufacturing corporations.
- Powers and duties.**
- Purpose.** SECT. 2. Said corporation is authorized to manufacture cotton, wool and flax, in the city of Lewiston, to purchase and hold real and personal estate not exceeding two million dollars in value, to
