Chapter 310.

An act to incorporate the Madawaska Mills.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Corporators.

Powers, duties,

Sect. 1. Lyman Nichols, E. D. Jordan and Edward F. Cutter, their associates, successors and assigns, are constituted and made a body politic and corporate by the name of the Madawaska Mills, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties and liabilities provided by the laws of this state concerning manufacturing corporations.

Purpose.

Sect. 2. Said corporation is authorized to manufacture cotton, wool and flax, in the city of Lewiston, to purchase and hold real and personal estate not exceeding fifteen hundred thousand dollars in value, to build and erect such buildings and machinery as their convenience may require, and make all necessary rules and regulations for the prosecution of the same, consistent with the laws of

Sect. 3. Lyman Nichols is hereby authorized to call the first meeting of these corporators, by giving to each of the others a written notice of the same seven days before such meeting.

Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

Chapter 311.

An act to authorize Reuel Philbrook to extend a wharf into the tide waters of Camden Harbor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Location.

SECT. 1. Reuel Philbrook of Camden, in the county of Knox, his heirs, associates and assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered to build and maintain upon his own land in the tide waters

of Camden harbor in said Camden, an addition to his wharf known Chap. 312. as the Mansfield wharf, by extending said wharf in an easterly Direction and direction into tide waters of said Camden harbor thirty-five feet beyond where it now is.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

Chapter 312.

An act to incorporate the Saco and Boston Steamboat Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Richard F. C. Hartly, Abraham Cutter, Thomas H. Corporators. Cole, S. A. Boothby, L. R. Folsom, George F. Calef, B. E. Cutter, F. A. Day, William E. Donnell, Joseph Hobson, Charles Hardy, Charles Hill, Francis Leavitt, their associates and successors, are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name of Name and the Saco and Boston Steamboat Company, to convey passengers purpose. and freight between the various ports or places in this state, Portsmouth and Boston, with all the powers and privileges, and subject Powers and to all the duties and liabilities, provided by the general laws of this state.

The said corporation may purchase and hold real and Capital. personal estate to an amount not exceeding two hundred thousand dollars, with full power to manage and dispose of the same.

Sect. 3. Any two of the persons named in this act may call Organization. the first meeting of said corporation, at such time and place as they may see fit, by giving five days' personal notice, for the purpose of organizing said corporation.

Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

An act to incorporate the town of Mars Hill.
