Chap. 314. inhabitants of said town are hereby invested with all the powers, privileges, immunities and liabilities of other towns.

Organization.

Sect. 2. Any justice of the peace within the county of Aroostook, is hereby empowered to issue his warrant to some inhabitant of said town directing him to notify the inhabitants thereof to meet at such time and place as he shall appoint, to choose such officers as other towns are empowered to choose at their annual meeting.

Town vested with effects and obligations of plantation.

Sect. 3. The town hereby created shall take the effects belonging to Mars Hill plantation, and shall also assume all the obligations thereof.

Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

Approved February 21, 1867.

#### Chapter 314.

An act to authorize the town of Winn to exempt certain property from taxation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Exemption of hotel property.

Sect. 1. The town of Winn is hereby authorized to exempt from taxation, for the term of ten years, a hotel lot, hotel property, house and appurtenances, if such an establishment shall be built; the sum to be expended to be not less than ten thousand dollars; provided the town shall so vote at their next annual town meeting.

Proviso.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

#### Chapter 315.

An act to authorize James C. Storer, Samuel T. Cleaveland, Joshua P. Simonton and John W. Simonton, to extend a wharf into tide waters of Camden Harbor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Corporators.

Location.

Sect. 1. James C. Storer, Samuel T. Cleaveland, Joshua P. Simonton and John W. Simonton, of Camden, in the county of Knox, their heirs, associates and assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered to build and maintain upon their land, in the tide waters of Camden harbor, in said Camden, certain additions to
