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by said treasurer after publishing notice thereof, in some newspaper printed in Augusta, three weeks successively prior to the time of sale, and posting written notices thereof in two public and conspicuous places in said city.

SECT. 2. The city of Augusta is hereby authorized to raise money by loan or otherwise, by vote of the city council, to pay the assessment on the shares held by said city.

CHAP. 344.

Assessment on shares held by city, how provided for.

SECT. 3. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

### Chapter 344.

An act to amend "an act to authorize John McIntire to extend a wharf in the town of Camden," approved February eighth, eighteen hundred and sixty-seven.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

An act to authorize John McIntire to extend a wharf in the town of Camden, is hereby amended by adding the following proviso to the first section of said act: *provided that said John McIntire shall have no authority under this act to extend his wharf until he has first obtained the consent of the abutters.*

Consent of abutters to be obtained.

### Chapter 345.

An act to authorize the First Parish in Falmouth to sell and convey certain lands.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. Authority is hereby given to Reuben Merrill, Nathaniel Merrill and E. N. Tewksbury, or any two of them, to sell and convey, in behalf of the First Church and Parish in Falmouth, sixty acres of land in said Falmouth, granted to said church and parish under their name then of the Second Church and Parish of Falmouth, at New Casco, for the use of their minister and his successors forever, by the proprietors of Falmouth, January twenty-one, seventeen hundred and seventy-four; *provided that said persons shall be elected trustees for that purpose by said First Church and Parish at a meeting legally called under the provisions of "an act additional to chapter twelve of the revised statutes, relating to parishes, religious societies and meeting-houses," approved February first, eigh-*

Sale of estate and by whom made.

Proviso as to election by parish and disposal of proceeds.
