CHAP. 392.

Treasurer to issue warrants for enforcing collection of delinquent taxes.

To be directed to sheriffs or deputies.

Towns precluded from drawing school money when tax is unpaid.

SECT. 4. Whenever for the period of forty days after the time fixed for the payment of this tax there shall be any delinquency to pay the same, on the part of the collector of any city, town or plantation, it shall be the duty of the treasurer of the state to issue his warrant for enforcing the collection of the same against such collector. The warrant shall be directed to the sheriff or his deputies of the appropriate county, and made in accordance with the laws already existing on that subject, except that it shall be returnable in ninety days from its date, and in addition to the tax itself, it shall require the officer to collect interest thereon at the rate of six per centum yearly, from the day when the tax became payable, with fifty cents more for the warrant, and the lawful fees of such sheriff or deputies arising thereon.

SECT. 5. When any state tax assessed upon any city or town remains unpaid, such city or town is precluded from drawing from the state treasury the school fund set apart for such city or town, so long as such tax remains unpaid.

SECT. 6. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

Chapter 392.

An act to incorporate the Knox Agricultural and Horticultural Society.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. N. A. Farwell, C. W. Snow, John P. Wise, S. N. Hatch, George W. Kimball junior, S. I. Lovejoy, M. C. Andrews, Leander Weeks, O. J. Conant, C. G. Moffitt, W. H. Buxton, Calvin Bickford, Zuingulus Collins, Ebenezer Cobb, M. W. Farwell, Geo. S. Wiggin, John T. Berry, G. W. Brown, I. K. Kimball, Alden Ulmer, J. A. Ingraham and Wm. Wilson, their associates, successors and assigns, be and they are hereby created a corporation by the name of the Knox Agricultural and Horticultural Society, with power by that name to sue and be sued; to have and use a common seal; to make by-laws and all necessary regulation for the management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of this state; and to have all the rights

and privileges, and be subject to all the liabilities of similar societies in this state. CHAP. 393.

SECT. 2. Said society is hereby established within the towns which comprise the county of Knox, and may take and hold real estate at a cost of five thousand dollars, (including grounds for fairs and race-course,) and personal property to the amount of five thousand dollars. Location and capital.

SECT. 3. The first meeting of said corporation may be called by any three of the persons named in the first section of this act, by giving such notice of the time, place and objects thereof, as they think proper; and at said meeting, the officers of said corporation may be chosen, and such other corporative business done as may be deemed proper. Organization, &c.

SECT. 4. The treasurer of the Lincoln County Agricultural Society shall pay over to the treasurer of the Knox Agricultural and Horticultural Society, such portion of the fund of the Lincoln County Society, after all its present liabilities are paid, as shall be deemed equitable by a committee of three, to be appointed on the part of each society. Fund of Lincoln County Society, how proportioned and transferred.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved by the governor.

Chapter 393.

An act to provide in part for the expenditures of government.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. In order to provide for several acts and resolves of the legislature requiring the payment of money from the treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of government for the current fiscal year, the following sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury, and the governor with the advice and consent of the council is hereby authorized at any time prior to the first day of January next, to draw his warrant upon the treasury for the same.
