Chapter 78.

Resolve relative to the restoration of sea-fish to the rivers and inland waters of Maine.

Resolved, That the governor, by and with the advice and consent of the council, be authorized to appoint two commissioners, whose duty it shall be to examine the rivers and other waters of this state, or such part thereof as they may deem sufficient, to the consideration of the subject of the restoration of sea-fish to our lakes and their tributary streams—the introduction of new varieties of fresh water fish, and the protection of fish generally in our inland waters; said commissioners to report such facts and suggestions as may be material, to the next legislature, or to the governor if they deem an earlier report expedient; and that such commissioners communicate with commissioners that are, or may be appointed by the states of Massachusetts and New Hampshire, upon the restoration of sea-fish, and that the governor be requested to furnish the governors of those states with a copy of this resolve.

Resolved, That such commissioners be authorized to introduce into such waters as they may deem best suited therefor, the spawn of the black bass, land locked salmon, and other varieties, if they deem it expedient; *provided* the expense does not exceed the sum of one thousand dollars, and that the governor and council be empowered to examine and audit the accounts of the said commissioners, allowing them a reasonable compensation for their services; and the governor shall draw his warrant upon the treasury for the same.
