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CHAP. 79.**Chapter 79.**

Resolve authorizing the land agent to convey a lot of land to James McKeen.

James McKeen,  
in favor of.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be and he is hereby authorized to convey to James McKeen of Crystal plantation, the northwest quarter of section numbered thirty, in township numbered four, in the fifth range west from the east line of the state; and the land agent in his deed of conveyance shall remit all additional settling duties.

**Chapter 80.**

Resolve in favor of Henry M. Harlow.

H. M. Harlow,  
in favor of.

*Resolved*, That the treasurer be and hereby is authorized to pay to Henry M. Harlow thirty dollars for coupon due September first, eighteen hundred sixty-five, on bond numbered one hundred and ten, (loan of eighteen hundred fifty-six for one thousand dollars,) and alleged to be lost; *provided* said Henry M. Harlow shall execute and deliver to said treasurer a bond of indemnity to be approved by the governor and council securing the state against said coupon alleged to have been lost.

**Chapter 81.**

Resolve authorizing the land agent to convey a lot of land to Rodney C. Barker.

R. C. Barker,  
in favor of.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be and he is hereby authorized to convey to Rodney C. Barker of Island Falls plantation, lot numbered one hundred twenty-four, in township number four range four in the county of Aroostook; and the land agent may remit the settling duties required to be performed, in so far as the law requires a residence of two years and the erection of a dwelling house upon said lot.

**Chapter 82.**

Resolve in favor of Willard Glidden.

W. Glidden,  
in favor of.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be authorized to convey to Willard Glidden a lot of land numbered ninety-one, in Woodland

plantation, range three west from the east line of the state; *provided* that the land agent shall first be satisfied that said lot has been paid for in labor upon the roads in said plantation.

### Chapter 83.

Resolve in favor of Rufus McIntire.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be authorized to convey to Rufus McIntire, a lot of land numbered thirty-eight, in Woodland plantation, range three west from the east line of the state; *provided* that the said McIntire shall, within three years from the approval of this resolve, pay fifty cents per acre for the same in labor upon the roads in said plantation, under the direction of the land agent.

### Chapter 84.

Resolve in favor of the town of Webster.

*Resolved*, That the secretary of state be directed to furnish the town of Webster with volumes forty-one and forty-two of the Maine Reports, belonging to the state and not otherwise appropriated.

### Chapter 85.

Resolve for the payment of lost bonds, coupons and other state securities.

*Resolved*, That all claims for the payment of any bond, coupon, scrip or other evidence of indebtedness issued by the state, and which may have been destroyed or lost, shall be referred to the governor and council, who may, upon satisfactory proof of such destruction or loss, cause payment of the same to be made, upon the claimant filing with the state treasurer, a bond with securities thereto, satisfactory to the said governor and council.
