**Chapter 111.**

CHAP. 111.

Resolve relating to files of the Northern Tribune, newspaper, in the custody of the clerk of the courts for the county of Lincoln.

*Resolved*, That the clerk of the courts for the county of Lincoln be authorized and directed to deliver to the clerk of the courts for the county of Sagadahoc all files of the Northern Tribune, newspaper, now in his custody, which were published in Bath previous to the year eighteen hundred fifty-four.

**Chapter 112.**

Resolve authorizing the land agent to convey a lot of land to the widow and children of a deceased soldier.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be authorized to convey to Anna L. Moore, widow of Charles W. Moore, late a private in the eighth regiment of Maine volunteers, deceased, lot number seventy, in township number four, range four, west east line of state, during widowhood, remainder to the children of said Charles W. Moore, and the land agent, in the deed of conveyance, is authorized to remit further settling duties.

**Chapter 113.**

Resolve in favor of Wales Hubbard.

*Resolved*, That the claim of Wales Hubbard for the balance of salary still remaining unpaid, during the time he performed the duties of reporter of judicial decisions, and for the amount that should be paid him under the act approved April fourth, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, be referred to the governor and council, who are hereby authorized to examine the same, and determine the amount he is entitled to, and the governor may draw his warrant for such amount, payable out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated.
