Chapter 123.

Resolve in favor of the joint standing committee on state reform school.

Committee on state reform school, in favor of. Resolved, That the state treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to pay J. H. Ramsdell, the sum of one hundred dollars, it being for expenses incurred by the committee in visiting the state reform school in January last.

Chapter 124.

Resolve in relation to the claims of the State of Maine against the United States for expenses incurred in the late rebellion.

Agent to settle claims against U.S., how paid. Resolved, That the governor and council be, and they are hereby authorized to settle the accounts of the agents charged by the executive with prosecuting the claims of the state against the government of the United States for expenses incurred in the late rebellion, allowing their reasonable expenses and a just compensation for services rendered, but no charge of commissions for sums obtained of the general government for the state, shall be allowed, and the governor with the advice of the council shall draw his warrant upon the treasurer of the state therefor.

Resolvo to amend chapter three hundred thirty-nine of resolves of eighteen hundred sixty-four.

Resolve of 1864, chap. 339 amended.

Resolved, That chapter three hundred thirty-nine of resolves of eighteen hundred sixty-four be, and the same is hereby amended by striking out words "one eighth sections."

Chapter 126.

Resolve in favor of Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians.

Passamaquoddy Indians, in favor of, for schools. Resolved, That there be paid out of the state treasury, under the direction of the governor and council, to the superintending school committee of the towns of Princeton and Perry, one hundred and fifty dollars, to be expended by them for the purpose of maintain-

ing a school or schools among the Passamaquoddy Indians, and Chap. 127. said committees are required to report as directed by resolve approved February twenty-second, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-five.

Resolve in favor of procuring a portrait of Abraham Lincoln, late President of the United States.

Resolved, That the governor shall select and appoint a suitable artist, who shall execute a portrait of Abraham Lincoln, late pres- Lincoln to be ident of the United States, under such directions as the governor the governor. may make; and the same portrait shall be placed in a conspicuous place in the State House; provided, that the cost of said portrait does not exceed one thousand dollars; and the governor and council are hereby instructed and authorized to draw their warrant for the amount that may be necessary to complete said portrait, not exceeding said amount.
