### Chapter 144.

An act to amend chapter eighty-six of the revised statutes relating to trustee disclosures.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. Section ten of chapter eighty-six of the revised statutes is amended by adding thereto the following words: 'And the court before whom any trustee is summoned may appoint a commissioner to take the examination and disclosure of such trustee, when any other reasonable cause appears, and prescribe the notice to be given to the plaintiff in the suit, of the time and place of such taking; and upon return of service made according to such order, the examination and disclosure shall be taken and sworn to before the commissioner; and being certified by him, and returned to court, the same proceedings may be had thereon as if it had been in court,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows :

'SECT. 10. On service made and returned according to the order of the justice, the examination and disclosure shall be taken and sworn to before him, and being certified and returned to court, the same proceedings may be had thereon as if it had been in court. And the court, before whom any trustee is summoned, may appoint a commissioner to take the examination and disclosure of such trustee, when any other reasonable cause appears, and prescribe the notice to be given to the plaintiff in the suit, of the time and place of such taking; and upon return of service made according to such order, the examination and disclosure shall be taken and sworn to before the commissioner; and being certified by him and returned to court, the same proceedings may be had thereon as if it had been in court.'
