### Chapter 173.

An act to grant certificates of service to soldiers who served in the war for the suppression of the rebellion.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The governor is hereby authorized to issue certificates Certificates for of appropriate design to all soldiers who served in the war for the suppression of the rebellion, and have been honorably discharged, and to widows or next in kin of such as have deceased, said certifi- soldiers and cate to contain a transcript of the record in the adjutant general's widows of deceased soldiers. office of the service of the soldier.

- SECT. 2. The cost of said certificates shall not exceed, in the aggregate, the sum of two thousand dollars.
- SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

#### Chapter 174.

An act to regulate certain fisheries.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Any person who shall use any weir, trap, seine or net, Restriction in other than a dip-net, for taking any kind of fish in any other than the taking of tide waters, except as hereinafter provided, shall be punished by a than tide fine of not more than fifty nor less than ten dollars, and shall for
