‘for debt; and for all purposes relating thereto, the assessors who assessed the taxes shall be deemed the creditors, and corresponding verbal alterations shall be made in the oath and certificate of discharge; but nothing in this chapter shall be construed as exempting from distress for taxes any property of any name or description, except those implements, tools, and articles of furniture, which are by law exempt from attachment for debt, as named in section seventy-nine of chapter six of the revised statutes relating to property exempt from distress for taxes.’

CHAP. 184.

—limitation of privileges.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 184.

An act to repeal an act entitled “an act to amend section four of chapter thirty-four of the revised statutes, relating to auctions and auctioneers.”

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Chapter one hundred and eighty-eight of the public laws of eighteen hundred and sixty, relating to auctions and auctioneers, is hereby repealed.

Public laws of 1860, chap. 188, repealed.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 185.

An act giving certain powers to the commissioners of fisheries.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. During the continuance in force of chapter seventy-eight of the resolves of eighteen hundred sixty-seven, entitled “resolve relative to the restoration of sea fish to rivers and inland waters of Maine,” the commissioners appointed under said resolve may, at their discretion, on petition of three or more responsible persons, exercise the powers granted to county commissioners in sections twenty-two, twenty-three and twenty-four of chapter forty of the revised statutes, and the proceedings shall be as provided in said sections; but this act shall not be so construed as to give the commissioners any other pay than that derived from the resolve continuing in force chapter seventy-eight of the resolves of eighteen hundred sixty-seven.

Authority to examine dams and order erection of fishways, conferred on commissioners appointed under chap. 78 of resolves of 1867.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
