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**Chapter 425.**

**CHAP. 425.**

An act to incorporate the Western Transportation and Mining Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. Abner Coburn, Philander Coburn, and Richard D. Rice, their successors, associates and assigns, are hereby created a body corporate by the name of the Western Transportation and Mining Company, with power to enter into contracts, to transport freight or passengers by land or water, to engage in mining or other lawful business, to acquire, hold and dispose of real and personal estate, to have a common seal, to adopt rules and regulations for the management of its financial affairs, and establish such by-laws as may be necessary for the convenient and orderly conduct of its business.

Corporators.

Powers and Purpose.

SECT. 2. The capital stock of said company shall be one hundred thousand dollars, divided into shares of one hundred dollars each, which may be increased by a vote of the directors of said company.

Capital.

SECT. 3. The first meeting of the company for organization may be called by any two of the corporators, on written notice to all the corporators and associates, stating the time and place of meeting, ten days at least before the day named therefor. Subsequent meetings shall be provided for in the by-laws.

Organization.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

**Chapter 426.**

An act to amend chapter three hundred and forty-six of private laws of eighteen hundred and forty-six, authorizing the erection of a dam across Weskeag river in South Thomaston.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Section second of said chapter is hereby amended by striking out the word "Lincoln" in the tenth line of said section and inserting the word 'Knox' instead thereof, so that the ninth, tenth and eleventh lines shall read as follows, to wit:—'Such damages as shall be ascertained and determined by the county commissioners for the county of Knox, in the same manner and under the same conditions and limitations as by law provided.'
