be disposed of for the pecuniary benefit of any one or more private individuals,—to make and execute any by-laws for the convenient management of their affairs, not repugnant to the laws of the state, and generally to have and enjoy all the powers and privileges incident to a corporation instituted for literary and scientific purposes.

CHAP. 445.

By-laws.

SECT. 2. W. H. Stuart is hereby authorized to call the first meeting of these corporators, by posting a notice of the same in the library room, at said Richmond, at least three days before the time of said meeting.

Organization.

SECT. 3. The powers granted by this act may be enlarged, restrained, or amended, at the pleasure of the legislature.

Liabilities and conditions of charter.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 445.

An act to incorporate The Bradley Union Hall Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Darius Eddy, James J. Norris, Ware Eddy, Moses Brown, Samuel F. Harrison, J. M. Bickford, and others, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a body corporate, by the name of The Bradley Union Hall Company, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining at said Bradley a building with its appurtenances for a public hall, and such other purposes connected therewith not inconsistent with the laws of this state, and for these purposes the said corporators may take and hold property, real and personal, not exceeding ten thousand dollars in value, with power to manage the same as they may think proper, with all the rights and privileges provided by the laws of the state respecting corporations.

Corporators.

Location and purpose.

Capital.

SECT. 2. James J. Norris, or either of the other persons named in the first section of this act, may call the first meeting of said corporation, by serving written notice thereof on each of the said corporators, at least seven days before the meeting.

Organization.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
