#### WHARF IN SEAL HARBOR,-WHARF IN CAMDEN HARBOR.

a copy of the record of the vote of said town accepting the same, with the clerk of the city of Auburn when elected, who shall transcribe such copy into the records of the city, and such record shall be conclusive evidence that this act has been accepted.

SECT. 23. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act Acts inconare hereby repealed, from and after the time when this act shall have been accepted as aforesaid, and the government shall have been organized as herein provided.

SECT. 24. This act shall take effect when approved by the gov- When ernor, so far as to authorize its submission to the legal voters of the town of Auburn in the manner herein prescribed, and when accepted by said voters, shall be in full force and effect.

#### Chapter 472.

An act to authorize I. A. Clark and O. B. Jones to extend a wharf into the tide waters of Seal harbor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. I. A. Clark and O. B. Jones, of South Thomaston, in Location. the county of Knox, their heirs, associates and assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered to build and maintain, in front of their granite quarry, on the western end of Spruce Head island, in said town of South Thomaston, a wharf extending along the breadth Limits. of said granite quarry, on said island, and into the tide water of Seal harbor two hundred feet, in a northwesterly direction.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

#### Chapter 473.

An act to authorize Ezra Hall to extend a wharf into the tide waters of Camdon harbor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Ezra Hall, of Camden, in the county of Knox, his Location. heirs, associates and assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered to build and maintain in front of his land, on the easterly side of Camden harbor, in said Camden, a wharf extending along the Limits. CHAP. 474. shore one hundred and forty-eight and one-half feet, and to extend the same into tide waters in a westerly direction ninety feet from the shore line.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

#### Chapter 474.

An act to establish an additional session of the county commissioners of the county of Piscataquis.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. An additional session of the county commissioners shall be holden at Dover, in the county of Piscataquis, on the first Tuesday of August annually.

SECT. 2. This act shall not affect pending proceedings in said sessions.

#### Chapter 475.

An act authorizing William Frye to extend a wharf in the tide waters of Camden harbor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. William Frye, of Camden, in the county of Knox, his heirs, associates and assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered to build and maintain in front of his land on the easterly side of Camden harbor, in said Camden, a wharf extending along the shore one hundred and seventy-one feet, or the width of his lot between land of John F. Gilkey and Jabe Adams and S. A. Jones, and extending into tide waters in a westerly direction, on the southern end ninety feet, and on the northern end fifty-six feet, or to the eastern edge of the channel.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
