Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 474.

An act to establish an additional session of the county commissioners of the county of Piscataquis.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Session to be holden on first Tuesday of August annually. SECT. 1. An additional session of the county commissioners shall be holden at Dover, in the county of Piscataquis, on the first Tuesday of August annually.

Sect. 2. This act shall not affect pending proceedings in said sessions.

Chapter 475.

An act authorizing William Frye to extend a wharf in the tide waters of Camden harbor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Location.

Limits of extension.

Sect. 1. William Frye, of Camden, in the county of Knox, his heirs, associates and assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered to build and maintain in front of his land on the easterly side of Camden harbor, in said Camden, a wharf extending along the shore one hundred and seventy-one feet, or the width of his lot between land of John F. Gilkey and Jabe Adams and S. A. Jones, and extending into tide waters in a westerly direction, on the southern end ninety feet, and on the northern end fifty-six feet, or to the eastern edge of the channel.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
