PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE.

1868.

SECT. 2. The capital stock of said corporation shall consist of **CHAP. 486.** seventy-five thousand shares, of the par value of five dollars for **Capital.** each share.

SECT. 3. The first meeting of said corporation, for the choice of **Organization.** officers, may be called at Bangor, by either of the persons named in this act, by giving notice in writing to each of the other corpora- tors, of the time and place of such meeting.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 486.

An act authorizing the proprietors of the bridge over north branch of Marsh river, in Frankfort, to surrender their charter, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legis- lature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The proprietors of the bridge across the north branch **May transfer** of Marsh river, in the town of Frankfort, are hereby authorized to **bridge to town.** transfer their charter, franchise, bridge and stock therein, to the town of Frankfort, without receiving any payment therefor, and said town is hereby authorized to accept the same.

SECT. 2. If said town of Frankfort, after receiving not less **If transfer not** than fourteen days' notice of the tender of such transfer, shall not, **accepted, may** within twelve months after the passage of this act, accept said **surrender** transfer, then, in such case, said proprietors may surrender their **charter.** charter.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 487.

An act to incorporate the Hallowell and Augusta Granite Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legis- lature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Joseph R. Bodwell, Charles Wilson, S. F. Allen, and **Corporators.** their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a body corporate, by the name of the Hallowell and Augusta Granite Company, for the purpose of quarrying, cutting, dressing and **Purpose.** shipping granite in all its forms, for building and other purposes.

SECT. 2. The capital stock of said corporation shall be one **Capital.** hundred thousand dollars, divided into shares of one hundred dol-

lars each; and said corporation is authorized to purchase, hold, improve, lease or sell, real and personal estate not exceeding in value at any one time the sum of one hundred thousand dollars, and shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties and liabilities, of similar corporations, as defined by the laws of this state.

Organization.

SECT. 3. Either of the persons herein named as corporators may call the first meeting of the corporation by giving seven days' personal notice thereof to the other corporators.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 488.

An act to incorporate the Fox Island and Spruce Head Granite Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Corporators.

SECT. 1. Joseph R. Bodwell, Moses Webster, E. P. Walker, John S. Case, and their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a body corporate, by the name of the Fox Island and Spruce Head Granite Company, for the purpose of quarrying, cutting, dressing and shipping granite in all its forms, for building and other purposes.

Purpose.

Capital.

SECT. 2. The capital stock of said corporation shall be one hundred and fifty thousand dollars, divided into shares of one hundred dollars each; and said corporation is authorized to purchase, hold, improve, lease or sell, real and personal estate not exceeding in value at any one time the sum of one hundred and fifty thousand dollars, and shall have all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the duties and liabilities, of similar corporations, as defined by the laws of this state.

SECT. 3. Either of the persons herein named as corporators may call the first meeting of the corporation by giving seven days' personal notice thereof to the other corporators.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
