SECT. 3. The capital stock of this company shall not exceed **Shares.**
 one hundred thousand dollars, divided into such shares, which may
 be sold, as the company may determine.

SECT. 4. The places of business of this company, shall be in the **Location.**
 city of Rockland and the town of Jonesport.

SECT. 5. Either of the corporators is authorized to call the first **Organization.**
 meeting of this corporation, by giving twenty-four hours previous
 personal notice to each of the others, of the time and place of
 meeting, and such by-laws and rules may be adopted, not incon-
 sistent with the laws of this state, and officers chosen, as the
 company may deem expedient, until which election the persons
 herein named shall act as directors.

SECT. 6. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 499.

An act to incorporate the Lincoln Centre Union Hall Association.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legis-
 lature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. Nelson Jordan, George W. Heald, James M. Adams, **Corporators.**
 A. P. Reed and William R. Hersey, their associates, successors
 and assigns, are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate,
 by the name of the Lincoln Centre Union Hall Association, for the **Name and
 purpose.**
 purpose of building and maintaining in the town of Lincoln, in the
 county of Penobscot, a building or block of buildings for a public
 hall, and for other uses.

SECT. 2. Said corporation may take and hold, by purchase, be- **Capital.**
 quest or otherwise, estate, real and personal, to the amount of five
 thousand dollars, may erect and maintain in Lincoln Centre village, **Location.**
 in said Lincoln, a building or block of buildings, to be used for
 stores, halls, and for other purposes, and may use, improve, rent,
 lease, sell, convey and transfer, the corporate property, as the
 corporators may desire, in any manner not repugnant to the laws
 of the state.

SECT. 3. Said corporation shall have all the powers and privi- **Powers, privi-
 leges, duties,
 &c.**
 leges, and be subject to all the duties and liabilities, of similar
 corporations, as defined by the laws of this state.

SECT. 4. The first meeting of said corporation may be called by **Organization.**
 Nelson Jordan, or either of the other persons named in the first

section of this act, by giving to each of the other corporators written notice of such meeting, stating the time when, and the place where, such meeting is to be held, seven days previous to said meeting.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 500.

An act to establish the Sagadahoc Petroleum, Coal and Mining Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. That Samuel D. Reed, Luther Storer, Edwin Noyes, Percy Morse, John L. Morse, Daniel Wildes, their associates, successors and assigns, be and they hereby are created a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Sagadahoc Petroleum, Coal and Mining Company, for the purpose of opening petroleum, coal and other mines and minerals, and working the same, in the county of Sagadahoc and elsewhere, with power to have and to hold estate real and personal, to the value of two hundred thousand dollars, and the same at pleasure to sell and dispose of as they may see fit, and said company shall be entitled to the rights and privileges, and be subject to the duties and requirements of the laws of this state.

SECT. 2. The legislature may at any time enlarge, restrain or annul the powers granted by this act.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 501.

An act to amend chapter two hundred fifty-one of the private laws of eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, entitled "an act additional to incorporate the Augusta Free Bridge Company."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

How amended.

SECT. 1. Section four of chapter two hundred and fifty-one of the private laws of the year eighteen hundred and sixty-seven, entitled "An act additional to incorporate the the Augusta Free Bridge Company," is hereby repealed.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
