Capital.

Purpose.

chapter forty-six of the revised statutes. SECT. 2. The capital stock of said corporation shall be, not

exceeding one hundred thousand dollars, divided into shares of twenty-five dollars each.

SECT. 3. Said corporation is authorized to manufacture and sell machines for sharpening and gumming, or deepening, saws, and to sell patent rights to manufacture and use the same.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 505.

An act to incorporate Siloam Lodge, number ninety-two, of Free and Accepted Masons.

Totman, their associates and successors, are hereby incorporated into a body politic, by the name of Siloam Lodge, number ninety-two, of Free and Accepted Masons, to be established and have their place of business in the town of Fairfield, in the county of Somerset, with power to acquire, by
