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**CHAP. 505.** powers, duties and liabilities of corporations, as prescribed in chapter forty-six of the revised statutes.

**Capital.**        **SECT. 2.** The capital stock of said corporation shall be, not exceeding one hundred thousand dollars, divided into shares of twenty-five dollars each.

**Purpose.**        **SECT. 3.** Said corporation is authorized to manufacture and sell machines for sharpening and gumming, or deepening, saws, and to sell patent rights to manufacture and use the same.

**SECT. 4.** This act shall take effect when approved.

### Chapter 505.

An act to incorporate Siloam Lodge, number ninety-two, of Free and Accepted Masons.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

**Corporators.**    **SECT. 1.** Stephen A. Nye, T. W. Fogg, Charles Mariner, F. H. Foss, Augustus Bradbury, M. D. Stratton, W. A. Shepard, F. Kendrick, Jr., Henry Kelly, G. W. Wetherell, G. N. Spaulding, O. W. Laury, F. E. McFadden, C. G. Totman, S. S. Brown, J. W. Channing, E. H. Evans, George O. Brown, Moses Fogg, Owen G. Flood, Stephen Wing and F. M. Totman, their associates and successors, are hereby incorporated into a body politic, by the name of Siloam Lodge, number ninety-two, of Free and Accepted Masons, to be established and have their place of business in the town of Fairfield, in the county of Somerset, with power to acquire, by purchase or otherwise, real and personal estate to the value of five thousand dollars, to give and grant, or bargain and sell the same at pleasure, with all the powers and privileges usually granted to corporations for masonic, benevolent and charitable purposes, not inconsistent with the laws of this state.

**Location.**        **SECT. 2.** F. E. McFadden, S. S. Brown, and J. W. Channing, are hereby authorized to call the first meeting of said corporation, by posting a notice thereof in some public and conspicuous place in said town, fourteen days at least before said meeting.

**Powers, &c.**        **SECT. 3.** This act shall take effect when approved.
