PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

SECT. 7. The corporation hereby created shall be subject to the provisions, and possess the general powers specified in reference to kindred and educational societies in the revised statutes of the state of Maine; and the legislature may at any time modify, alter or repeal this act.

Conditions.

Chapter 514.

An act to increase the pay of the county commissioners of Penobscot county.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Instead of the compensation now established by law, each county commissioner of the county of Penobscot shall receive three dollars a day, and in that proportion for part of a day, while actually employed in the service of the county, including the time necessarily spent in making drafts, or other labor, and exclusive of time spent in travelling, for which he shall be allowed twelve cents a mile for the distance actually travelled. His account shall specify the kind of service performed each day or part of a day. They are not to be allowed for service or travel on more than one petition or case at the same time, or for any additional trouble or expense of any kind.

Compensation to be three dollars per diem.

Twelve cents per mile allowed for travel.

Accounts to specify kind of service performed.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect from and after the first day of January, in the year eighteen hundred and sixty-eight.

Chapter 515.

An act to amend the acts to incorporate the Portland Five Cents Savings Bank.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The first section of the act incorporating the Portland Five Cents Savings Bank, is amended, by inserting, instead of its present name, the name of 'Maine Savings Bank,' so that section, as amended, shall read as follows:

CHAP. 516. ' assigns, are hereby incorporated into a company, by the name of
 Name, loca- ' the Maine Savings Bank, to be located in the city of Portland,
 tion, powers, ' with all the powers and privileges conferred upon similar institu-
 &c. ' tions by the laws of this state, and subject to all the liabilities and
 ' restrictions thereof.'

Amendment to
 section 2.

SECT. 2. Section two of said act, is amended, by striking out
 the word "five," and inserting, in lieu thereof, 'twenty-five;' so
 that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

Deposits limit-
 ed to 25 cents.

'Section 2. Said institution shall receive on deposit sums of
 ' money as small as twenty-five cents.'

Rights and
 liabilities and
 former name
 not affected.

SECT. 3. This act shall not affect any rights accruing or accrued
 to, or any liabilities incurred by said bank, by any prior name of
 said bank, but may be enforced by or against said bank under the
 name of said Maine Savings Bank.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 516.

An act to extend the time for the collection of taxes in the town of Lebanon.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legis-
 lature assembled, as follows:*

Time for col-
 lection and
 liens for taxes
 extended two
 years.

SECT. 1. That the time for the collection of a tax assessed on the
 owners of land in the town of Lebanon, in the county of York, by
 virtue of a vote passed on the twelfth day of January, in the year
 eighteen hundred and sixty-five, at a legal town meeting of the
 inhabitants of said town, and the lien thereby created on said lands,
 shall continue in force two years from April thirteenth, eighteen
 hundred and sixty-seven, when the assessors of said town ap-
 pointed a collector to collect the balance of said tax then due.

Appointment of
 collector in
 1867, and acts
 of same, made
 valid.

SECT. 2. The appointment of a collector by the assessors of
 Lebanon, April thirteenth, in the year eighteen hundred and sixty-
 seven, to collect the amount of the aforesaid tax then due and un-
 paid, and the commitment and warrant, and the acts of said
 collector in accordance with the laws of the state of Maine for the
 collection of taxes, are all hereby made valid and binding.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
