CHAP. 587.

Conditions.

SECT. 3. This act shall be subject to all the privileges, liabilities and conditions of the original charter of said company.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 587.

An act to incorporate the Miller Commercial Wharf Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.

SECT. 1. James Miller, J. A. Miller, Robert Emery, David W. Dyer, and Samuel Miller, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a corporation, by the name of the Miller Commercial Wharf Company, for the purpose of carrying on the wharf and dock business in the city of Belfast, with power by that name to sue and be sued, use a common seal, and have all the privileges and powers and be subject to all the liabilities and requirements of corporations, as defined in the laws of this state.

Purpose.

Location.

Powers, &c.

Capital.

SECT. 2. The said corporation may purchase and hold real and personal estate to the amount of twenty-five thousand dollars, with full power to manage and dispose of the same.

Organization.

SECT. 3. Any three of the persons named in this act may call the first meeting of said corporation, at such time and place as they may see fit, by giving two weeks' notice in some newspaper published in Belfast, for the purpose of organizing said corporation.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 588.

An act to regulate the driving of logs on the Penamaquon river in Pembroke.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Passage of logs through certain dams without permission of owners, prohibited.

SECT. 1. No person or persons shall be permitted to drive or sluice logs by or through any dam used for mill or manufacturing purposes and lawfully existing on the Penamaquon river in Pembroke, without the consent of the owner of such dam, except as hereinafter provided.
