Sect. 2. Any person intending to drive or sluice by or through CHAP. 589. such dam, his own or the logs of another, may do so, using rea- Persons may sonable dispatch, at any time before the tenth day of June in each year, or at any other time when the water in said river is so high senson and as to cause it to run to waste over the top of such dam; provided by giving prior notice to owners he shall have given to the owner or person in charge of such dam of dams, notice, in writing, of such intention twenty-four hours before the time mentioned in said notice for such driving or sluicing.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 589.

An act to incorporate the Saint Johns Lodge, number fifty-one, of Free and Accepted Masons.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sect. 1. Sylvanus Hayward, Alonzo Stackpole, Lysander B. Corporators. Young, George C. Yeaton, Shipley W. Ricker, John H. Burleigh, Elisha H. Jewett, their associates and successors, are hereby incorporated and made a body politic, by the name of Saint Johns Name and Lodge, number fifty-one, of Free and Accepted Masons, to be established and have their place of business in the town of South Berwick, in the county of York, with power to acquire by purchase or otherwise real and personal estate to the value of twenty thousand dollars, to give and grant or bargain and sell the same at pleasure, with all the powers and privileges usually granted to corporations for masonic, benevolent and charitable purposes, not inconsistent with the laws of the state.

Sect. 2. The first meeting of said corporation may be called Organization, by either of the persons named in the first section of this act, by publishing notice thereof in one of the newspapers in said county of York, fourteen days at least before said meeting.

This act shall take effect when approved.
