Chapter 607.

An act to incorporate the Maine Publishing Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Corporators.

Powers, &c.

Sect. 1. Eben Burnham, E. H. Foss, M. Watson, O. T. Garey and C. A. Shaw, their associates, successors and assigns, are constituted and made a body corporate and politic, by the name of the Maine Publishing Company, with power by that name to sue and be sued, to have a common seal and alter the same, and with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the liabilities and immunities of like corporate bodies under the laws of the state.

Capital.

Sect. 2. Said corporation shall have a capital stock of twelve thousand dollars, divided into shares of twenty-five dollars each, with the privilege of increasing the same to not exceeding fifteen thousand dollars.

Location and purpose.

SECT. 3. Said corporation is authorized to carry on the business of book-binding, and printing and publishing in the city of Biddeford, and to print and publish in said city and sell there or elsewhere, school-books, magazines, newspapers, pamphlets and any similar matter not prohibited by the laws of the state.

Corporate property.

Sect. 4. Said corporation is authorized to purchase, lease and hold such real and personal property as it may deem necessary for the proper transaction of its business, and to sell, lease, convey and manage the same.

Organization.

Sect. 5. E. H. Foss or O. T. Garey, herein named, are authorized to call the first meeting of said corporation, by serving three days' written notice on each of the other corporators.

Sect. 6. This act shall take effect when approved.

An act to incorporate the Preble Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons.
