Chapter 198.

CHAP. 198.

Resolve in favor of John B. Hayes.

Resolved, That the land agent be, and is hereby, authorized and directed to deed to John B. Hayes, lot number sixty-seven, in township I, range two, W. E. L. of state, now Forestville plantation, in the county of Aroostook, when he is satisfied that the road labor is paid, and is furnished with the certificate given him in eighteen hundred and sixty-two, of said lot.

Chapter 199.

Resolve in favor of Mary Waite.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to convey to Mary Waite, lot number eighty one, in the town of Fort Fairfield; the road labor having been paid, no additional settling duties shall be required to be done upon said lot.

Chapter 200.

Resolve in favor of John A. Rowe.

Resolved, That the land agent is hereby authorized and directed to deed lot number sixty, in township number four, range five, in the county of Aroostook, to John A. Rowe, whenever he is satisfied the road labor is paid on said lot.

Resolve in favor of Lawrence O'Keefe.

Resolved, That the land agent be and is hereby authorized and directed to deed lot number seventy-five, in township four, range four, in Aroostook county, to Lawrence O'Keefe, by his presenting a certificate of said lot.
