CHAP. 208.**Chapter 208.**

Resolve in favor of the Richmond Library Association.

Books for Richmond Library Association.

*Resolved*, That the state librarian be, and he is hereby, directed to present to the Richmond Library Association one copy each of the reports of the adjutant general for the years eighteen hundred sixty-one to eighteen hundred sixty-seven, inclusive.

Approved February 17, 1868.

**Chapter 209.**

Resolve in favor of Sockabasin Swassian.

Sockabasin Swassian, in favor of.

*Resolved*, That there be paid from the treasury the sum of eighty-five dollars, to Sockabasin Swassian, for services before the legislature, as delegate for the Penobscot tribe of Indians.

Approved February 18, 1868.

**Chapter 210.**

Resolve relating to appropriation for the state library.

State library, \$300 for.

*Resolved*, That the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars, in addition to that allowed by law, be appropriated for the state library, to be expended as follows: three hundred dollars for the purchase of books, and fifty dollars for incidental expenses.

Approved February 18, 1868.

**Chapter 211.**

Resolve in favor of John Tobin.

John Tobin, in favor of.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be and he is hereby authorized and directed to convey to John Tobin, lot of land numbered forty-eight, in the town of Washburn, without requiring further settling duties.
