#### Chapter 215.

Resolve in favor of the heirs of the late James H. Lebroke.

Sarah Lebroke, in favor of.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to convey to Mrs. Sarah Lebroke, widow of the late James H. Lebroke, for the benefit of herself and her three children, lot numbered seventy, in block numbered seventy-nine, in Mapleton plantation, formerly number twelve, range three, without further consideration.

#### Chapter 216.

Resolve in favor of the joint standing committee on state reform school.

Committee on reform school, in favor of. Resolved, That the state treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to pay to Frederick G. Messer the sum of eighty dollars, it being for expenses incurred by the committee in visiting the state reform school in January last.

Approved February 24, 1868.

#### Chapter 217.

Resolvo in favor of the Portland Institute and Public Library.

Books for Portland Institute and Public Library. Resolved, That the secretary of state be, and he is hereby, authorized to furnish to the Portland Institute and Public Library a complete set of all the publications of the state government, or as many of such publications as can be conveniently furnished.
