Chapter 224.

CHAP. 224.

Resolve allowing the plantation of Eagle Lake, and Letter L, their school money for eighteen hundred and sixty-five.

Resolved, That there be allowed and paid out of the treasury of the state, to Eagle Lake plantation, in the county of Aroostook, as their proportion of school money for the year eighteen hundred and sixty-five, the sum of twenty-one dollars and twelve cents. Also, that there be allowed and paid out of the treasury to Letter L, in said county, as their share of school money for said year, the sum of twenty-four dollars twenty-seven cents.

Chapter 225.

Resolve in aid of the road across Indian township, in the county of Washington.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated, for repairing the road leading over Indian township, in the county of Washington, which sum shall include an equitable amount to be paid Ziba Haley in settlement for balance claimed by him, made in the year eighteen hundred and sixty-seven; to be expended under the direction of the land agent.

\$500 for road across Indian township.

Chapter 226.

Resolve in favor of Van Buren plantation, and L and K townships, in Aroostook county.

Resolved, That there be and is hereby appropriated, three hundred dollars, to be expended on the road in Van Buren plantation and letter L and K, in Aroostook county, under the direction of the land agent.

\$300 for roads in Van Buren, &c.

Chapter 227.

Resolve in aid of building a bridge over the Aroostook river, at Caribou village, in the town of Lyndon.

Resolved, That the sum of three thousand dollars be, and the same is hereby, appropriated, in aid of building a good and substantial bridge, over the Aroostook river in Caribou village, with

\$3,000 for building bridge at Caribou.

CHAP. 228. substantial abutments and piers, which shall compare favorably with the abutments and piers of the bridge erected at Maysville over said river; and when said abutments and piers shall be completed and certified to by the selectmen of the town of Lyndon, fifteen hundred dollars of said sum shall be paid by the land agent, and the balance, at the completion of said bridge, to the acceptance of the land agent.

Chapter 228.

Resolve in aid of building a bridge in the town of Plymouth, in the county of Penobscot.

\$1,000 for
bridge in
Plymouth.

Resolved, That the sum of one thousand dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated, to aid in the construction of a permanent and substantial bridge, to be erected in place of the present floating bridge in said town. The sum to be paid by the land agent as the work progresses.

Chapter 229.

Resolve in favor of Eunice B. Elliot.

Resolved, That the land agent be and he is hereby authorized and directed to convey lot of land numbered one hundred and twenty-nine, in Castle Hill, to Eunice B. Elliot.

Chapter 230.

Resolve authorizing the payment of certain private claims, from moneys received from the United States.

Payment of
certain private
claims.

Resolved, That when, in the settlement of the war claims of the state against the general government, there shall have been allowed and paid, on any particular voucher, an amount exceeding that which the state has paid thereon, and the same shall be established satisfactorily to the governor and council, the governor is hereby authorized to draw his warrant upon the treasurer of state for the amount of such difference, deducting therefrom a
