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CHAP. 228. substantial abutments and piers, which shall compare favorably with the abutments and piers of the bridge erected at Maysville over said river; and when said abutments and piers shall be completed and certified to by the selectmen of the town of Lyndon, fifteen hundred dollars of said sum shall be paid by the land agent, and the balance, at the completion of said bridge, to the acceptance of the land agent.

Chapter 228.

Resolve in aid of building a bridge in the town of Plymouth, in the county of Penobscot.

\$1,000 for

Resolved, That the sum of one thousand dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated, to aid in the construction of a permanent and substantial bridge, to be erected in place of the present floating bridge in said town. The sum to be paid by the land agent as the work progresses.

Chapter 229.

Resolve in favor of Eunice B. Elliot.

Resolved, That the land agent be and he is hereby authorized and directed to convey lot of land numbered one hundred and twenty-nine, in Castle Hill, to Eunice B. Elliot.

Chapter 230.

Resolve authorizing the payment of certain private claims, from moneys received from the United States.

Payment of
certain private
claims.

Resolved, That when, in the settlement of the war claims of the state against the general government, there shall have been allowed and paid, on any particular voucher, an amount exceeding that which the state has paid thereon, and the same shall be established satisfactorily to the governor and council, the governor is hereby authorized to draw his warrant upon the treasurer of state for the amount of such difference, deducting therefrom a

reasonable sum for the expense of collecting the same, in favor of the person on whose bill and voucher such payment has been made, to be paid out of the moneys collected on account of such claim. CHAP. 231.

Chapter 231.

Resolve authorizing the land agent to examine into the situation of the French settlements in the plantations of D'Aigle, Dion and Madawaska.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized and requested to examine into the situation of the French settlements in the plantations of D'Aigle, Dion and Madawaska, for the purpose of determining any additional measures to be recommended for confirming them in their possessions upon lands occupied in township eighteen, range six, eighteen, range five, and eighteen, range four, W. E. L. S. ; *provided however*, that no extra expense or donation shall be incurred by the state in consequence thereof.

Chapter 232.

Resolve providing for the publication of certain documents relating to the hydrographic survey of the state.

Resolved, That, the hydrographic survey having terminated, the governor and council be authorized to appoint some suitable person, with such compensation as they may determine, to properly arrange and prepare for publication the statistics submitted by the commissioners, with their report, in pursuance of resolve approved February twenty-eight, eighteen hundred sixty-seven, and shall cause twenty-five hundred copies to be printed, in a form suitable for distribution, five hundred copies to be reserved for members of the legislature and the departments, the remainder to be distributed in such manner as the governor may deem most conducive to the purposes intended by this survey ; and he is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the treasury for the sums necessary to carry this resolve into execution.
