CHAP. 246.**Chapter 246.**

Resolve in favor of Samuel H. Thompson.

Samuel H.
Thompson,
in favor of.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to convey by deed to Samuel H. Thompson, the northwest quarter of section numbered one hundred and five, in township number twelve, range three, W. E. L. S., and all additional settling duties required to be performed are hereby remitted.

Approved March 3, 1868.

Chapter 247.

Resolve in favor of the state prison.

\$25,000 for
state prison.

Resolved, That the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars is hereby appropriated to cover the deficit between last year's appropriation and the amount expended for building purposes, to complete the work already begun, to cover the deficit in current expenses, A. D. eighteen hundred sixty-seven, and increase the working capital of the institution.

Chapter 248.

Resolve authorizing the land agent to convey a section of land.

David Brown,
in favor of.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized to convey to David Brown, or assigns, section number fifty-six, in township number four, range five, in the county of Aroostook, or such part thereof as may be most for the interest of the state, at a price that may be determined by said land agent.
