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RESOLVES

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**Chapter 259.**

Resolve authorizing aid for erecting mills at Eagle Lake plantation.

In aid of mills  
at Eagle lake.

*Resolved*, That the proceeds, not exceeding five hundred dollars, or such sum as shall be derived from the sale of a parcel of land lying east of Eagle lake, in said plantation, be devoted to the erection of a saw and grist mill in process of construction on Gilman brook, in township sixteen, range seven, provided said mills shall be completed to the satisfaction of the land agent.

**Chapter 260.**

Resolve in favor of George W. Chamberlain.

*Resolved*, That the state treasurer pay to George W. Chamberlain, a member of the legislature from the Carmel district, one hundred dollars, for expenses incurred by reason of sickness during the present session.

**Chapter 261.**

Resolves relating to Antietam National Cemetery.

WHEREAS, That by an act entitled "An act to establish and to protect national cemeteries," approved February twenty-second, eighteen hundred sixty-seven, congress has adopted an uniform system for the management and care of all the soldiers' national cemeteries throughout the United States, and made provisions for their maintainance, therefore be it

*Resolved, by the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Maine in Legislature assembled*, That we respectfully request of, and recommend to, the legislature of the state of Maryland the passage of an act empowering the board of trustees having charge of the Antietam national cemetery at Sharpsburg, Maryland, to transfer all the right, title, interest and care of said Antietam national cemetery to the general government upon the completion of the same.

*Resolved*, That the governor be requested to cause a copy of these resolutions to be forwarded to the governor of Maryland, and to the board of trustees having charge of the Antietam national cemetery.
