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Chapter 262.

Resolve relative to a state industrial school for girls.

Resolved, That it is essential to the highest interests of the state Governor and that measures should be taken, at the earliest practicable day, to establish an industrial school for girls, in accordance with the sitions from recommendations of Hon. George B. Barrows, commissioner appointed under a resolve of the legislature of eighteen hundred and tion of indussixty-seven, to investigate the principles and operations of such girls. institutions; and with a view of securing co-operation in so desirable a work, the governor and council are hereby directed to invite and receive propositions from any town or city desiring to have such institution located within their limits, and to report the same to the next legislature.

Chapter 263.

Resolvo in favor of Samuel Larabee.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the state treasury to Samuel Samuel Lara-Larabee, the sum of sixty-five dollars and two cents, that sum bee, in favor being the amount, with interest, paid by said Larabee into the state treasury, September ninth, one thousand eight hundred sixty-three, for two half townships of land erroneously sold for non-payment of state and county taxes—as both state and county taxes had been paid into the state treasury previous to the day of sale.

Resolve in favor of Stevens & Sayward.

Resolved, That there be paid out of the treasury to Stevens & Stevens and Sayward, for furnishing two hundred and sixty-two copies of the Sayward, in Kennebec Journal, daily on order of the legislature, and for advertising in the same, notices of the legislature and of its committees, six hundred and seventy-nine dollars.
