Official bonds.

chosen in their stead. The persons elected treasurer and secretary, before entering upon the discharge of official duties, shall be sworn to the faithful performance thereof, and the treasurer shall also give bonds satisfactory to said corporation, for the faithful discharge of his duties; provided, however, that the offices of treasurer and secretary may, if deemed advisable, be united in one person.

Deeds of conveyance.

Sect. 4. All deeds, conveyances, covenants and grants, made by and in behalf of said corporation, shall be signed by the treasurer and secretary, and be sealed with the corporate seal, and when made in pursuance of any vote of the corporators, shall be valid and binding upon the corporation.

Annual meeting.

Sect. 5. The annual meeting of the corporators shall be holden in the month of May, and at the first meeting and all subsequent meetings, it shall require seven members to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business; other meetings may be called as the by-laws shall direct.

Sect. 6. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 45.

An act to authorize George S. Wiggin and Sumner Whitney to extend a wharf into the tide waters at Rockland.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Building of wharf into tide waters authorized. SECT. 1. George S. Wiggin and Sumner Whitney of Rockland, in the county of Knox, their heirs, associates and assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered to build and maintain along the front of their land on the southerly side of the Commercial wharf, so called, in the city of Rockland, a wharf composed of timber and granite, and extending in a southeasterly direction into the tide waters of the bay, five hundred feet.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

An act to incorporate the Pine Grove Cometery Association of Cherryfield.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:
