CHAP. 98.**Chapter 98.**

An act to incorporate the Barnard Slate Quarry Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.	SECT. 1. Thomas N. Egery, William Williams and F. F. French, and their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created and constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name of the
Corporate name.	Barnard Slate Quarry Company, and by that name may sue and be
May hold and dispose of real and personal property.	sued, adopt a common seal and alter the same at pleasure, may purchase, lease, rent, hold, hire, pledge and dispose of real and personal property deemed necessary for the uses and purposes of
Rights and privileges.	said company to an amount not exceeding one hundred thousand dollars, and in general to have and exercise all such other rights, powers, facilities and privileges as now appertain to manufacturing corporations in this state, and such as may be necessary and proper for the purpose of mining, quarrying, manufacturing and vending slate.
Purpose.	
First meeting, how called.	SECT. 2. The first meeting of this corporation shall be called by Thomas N. Egery, by notice in writing to each other corporator named, given at least five days prior to the time of said meeting.
Capital stock; shares.	SECT. 3. Said corporation may divide their original stock into such number of shares, and provide for the sale and transfer thereof in such manner and form as said corporation shall from time to time determine, not repugnant to the laws of this state.
Location.	SECT. 4. The office of said company shall be at Bangor in the county of Penobscot, and there all books of record and transfer shall be kept. The secretary of said company shall reside at Bangor, and a majority of the directors shall reside in this state.
Directors.	SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.
