UNION MUTUAL RELIEF SOCIETY.

SECT. 2. The provisions of section eighteen, chapter forty-six CHAP. 124. of the revised statutes, shall apply to said Star Match corporation. Provisions of This act shall take effect when approved. SECT. 3.

Chapter 124.

An act to incorporate the Union Mutual Relief Society.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Franklin C. Moody, L. H. Whitney, George F. Ayer, Corporators. Robert I. Hull and Job R. Duran, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby created a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Union Mutual Relief Society, for the purpose of Corporate name. granting aid to the families, heirs or assigns of deceased members Purpose. thereof, and by that name may sue and be sued, appear, prosecute Powers. and defend suits to final judgment and execution in all the courts of this state; may have and use a common seal, and make bylaws, not inconsistent with the constitution and laws of this state, for the due and orderly management of its affairs; for the raising of money from its members by assessment or otherwise, and for the disposition of the same; and for the establishment of con-Membership. &c. ditions of membership, and for such other purposes as may be deemed needful.

SECT. 2. Said corporation may take, hold and dispose of at Mayhold real and pleasure, real and personal estate to an amount not exceeding fifty thousand dollars, the same with the income thereof to be applied for the purposes set forth in the first section of this act.

The first meeting of said corporation may be called First meeting, SECT. 3. by any three of the persons named in this act, by giving notice in one or more newspapers published in Portland, of the time and place fixed upon, at least seven days before said meeting, and it shall be lawful for the corporators together with such associates May elect assoas they may elect, then and there to adopt by-laws in accordance by-laws. with the provisions of this act, and to elect such officers as may officers. be prescribed therein.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
