#### Снар. 139.

#### Chapter 139.

An act to prevent the throwing of edgings or other substances into Pennamaquon river.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Throwing of certain refuse lumber, &c., into rlyer prohibited. Sect. 1. It shall be unlawful for any owner or owners of mills on the Pennamaquon river, in the town of Pembroke, in the county of Washington, or any person or persons employed in or about said mills or otherwise, to cast any edgings or trimmings of deal, boards, laths, bark and grindings, shingles or other lumber, into the waters of Pennamaquon river.

Penalties.

Sect. 2. If any of the persons designated in section one of this act shall violate the provisions of said section, he or they shall be subject to a fine or penalty of not more than twenty nor less than five dollars, upon complaint and conviction before any court of competent jurisdiction.

Damage, how recovered. Sect. 3. Any person who may suffer damage to his lands, mill pond or mill privilege, by reason of the violation of the provisions of section one of this act, may recover for said damages by an action on the case of the person or persons so violating said section and causing said damage.

Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

### Chapter 140.

An act authorizing the town of Andover to raise, assess, collect and expend money to build and keep in repair a road from said Andover through Andover North Surplus and township letter C, to the Richardson lakes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Andover authorized to raise and expend money for certain purposes. Sect. 1. The town of Andover is hereby authorized and empowered to raise, assess, collect and expend yearly for ten years a sum not exceeding three hundred dollars a year, for the purpose of building, maintaining and repairing a road leading from said town of Andover through Andover North Surplus and township letter C, to the Richardson lakes, so called, being the road known as the Lake road. Said money to be raised, assessed, collected and expended as money and highway taxes for roads are raised, assessed, collected and expended in towns, subject, however, to a two-thirds vote of the voters of said town that are present and voting.

How raised, assessed, collected, &c.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
