CHAP. 156.**Chapter 156.**

An act to incorporate the town of Fort Kent.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Boundaries.

SECT. 1. Township numbered eighteen in the seventh range, and township numbered eighteen in the sixth range of townships in the county of Aroostook, excepting only river lots numbered fifty-seven, fifty-eight, fifty-nine, sixty, sixty-one and sixty-two, with lots numbered one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, nine, ten, eleven, twelve, thirteen, fourteen, fifteen, sixteen and seventeen, in the second tier of lots, and lot G in the tier of lots in said township numbered eighteen, range six, are hereby incorporated as a town by the name of Fort Kent, with all the rights and powers of towns, and subject to all the liabilities thereof.

Collectors of

SECT. 2. The collectors of D'Aigle and Fort Kent plantations shall have power to finish the collection of all taxes which shall have been committed to them for collection, prior to the passage of this act; and in case of unpaid non-resident taxes, shall be authorized to return them to the treasurer of the town of Fort Kent, as collectors of towns may now do; and the treasurer is hereby authorized to collect the same as treasurers of towns may now do.

SECT. 3. William Dickey is hereby authorized to call the first meeting for the organization of said town, by posting up two warrants in said town, seven days previous to the meeting, in the month of March or April following the approval of this act.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 157.

An act to prevent the taking of pickerel in Farrington and Upper Kezar ponds in Lovell, Oxford county.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

The taking of
pickerel in cer-
tain ponds, &c.,
prohibited during
March, April and
May of each year.

SECT. 1. The taking of pickerel from the waters of Farrington and Upper Kezar ponds or meadows, in Lovell, Oxford county, is hereby prohibited and made unlawful for and during the months of March, April and May of each year.

Penalty.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall take from the waters described in section one of this act, any pickerel within the time named in the foregoing section of this act, shall forfeit the sum of five dollars for each offence, to be recovered by complaint before a trial

justice on action of debt, one-half to go to the prosecutor and the other half to the town of Lovell, Oxford county. CHAP. 158.

Chapter 158.

An act to incorporate the Waterville Savings Bank.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. L. E. Thayer, J. F. Elden, Reuben Foster, T. W. Herrick, Wm. Tobey, J. Webber, H. A. Marston, J. P. Caffrey, Chas. A. Henrickson, B. A. Robie, G. L. Robinson, Luke Brown, W. L. Leslie, William Dyer, E. E. Getchell, G. B. Broad, Ira H. Low, S. C. Marston, N. G. H. Pulsifer, Jas. P. Blunt, E. F. Webb, G. A. Phillips, D. R. Wing, Homer Percival, Noah Boothby and C. F. Hathaway, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Waterville Savings Bank, with power by that name to prosecute and defend suits at law and in equity, to have and use a common seal, and make all such by-laws, rules and regulations as are necessary to the government and management of their concerns, and not repugnant to the laws of the state. Said corporation shall be established in the town of Waterville, and shall be subject to all the duties and liabilities, and enjoy all the rights and privileges conferred upon similar institutions by the laws of this state.

SECT. 2. The said corporation is hereby authorized to receive deposits of money, and to issue certificates therefor, and such deposits of money shall be used as they shall judge most for the benefit of said corporation ; and such deposits may be withdrawn at such reasonable times and in such manner as said corporation shall appoint, and the net income or profit thereof shall be divided among the persons making such deposits, their executors, administrators or assigns, in just proportion.

SECT. 3. Either of the four first corporators named herein may call the first meeting of said corporation by giving seven days' written notice to each of the other corporators, or by posting in some conspicuous place a notice of the same, two weeks before the meeting is held, at which meeting, and every subsequent annual meeting, said corporation may elect by ballot, any person or persons as members thereof ; may choose such officers as to them may seem proper for their organization and government, who shall so continue in office one year, and until others are chosen
