CHAP. 220.

Chapter 220.

An act to prevent the taking of pickerel in Three Mile pond in the towns of Vassalboro', China and Windsor.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Taking of pickerel in certain pond, regulated.

SECT. 1. No person shall take or destroy any pickerel in Three Mile pond, so called, situated in the towns of Vassalboro', China and Windsor, except by the ordinary process of angling with single bait hook and line or artificial fly, and not by hook and line, during the months of January, February, March, April and May in each year.

Penalty, how recovered.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this act shall forfeit for each fish so taken or destroyed, the sum of three dollars to be recovered in an action of debt, one-half to the use of the town where the offence is committed, and one-half to the person prosecuting therefor.

Chapter 221.

An act to incorporate the Saco Savings Bank.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.

SECT. 1. Marshall Pierce, Moses Lowell, Joseph G. Deering, Rufus P. Tapley, James M. Burbank, Edward Eastman, Ira A. Foss, Charles H. Milliken, Paul C. Sands, Charles C. Sawyer, I. E. L. Kimball, Joseph Hobson, Horace Woodman, Jason W. Beatty, Charles Hill, N. T. Boothbay, Cornelius Sweetsir, George A. Carter, Owen B. Chadbourne, Sumner S. Richards, James M. Deering, Rishworth Jordan, Stephen F. Shaw, Leonard Emmons, Tracey Hewes, Paul Chadbourne, George Parcher and James Andrews, their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate by the name of the Saco Savings Bank, with full power by that name to prosecute suits at law and in equity; to have and use a common seal, and to establish such by-laws, rules and regulations as are necessary for the government and management of their concerns, and not repugnant to the laws of this state. Said corporation shall be established in the city of Saco, in the county of York, and shall be subject to all the liabilities and the duties, and enjoy all the rights and privileges conferred upon similar institutions by the laws of this state.

SECT. 2. Said corporation is hereby authorized to receive deposits of money, and to issue certificates therefor, and such

deposits of money shall be used as they shall deem most for the interest and benefit of said corporation; and such deposits may be withdrawn at such reasonable times, and in such manner as said corporation shall appoint, and the net income or profit thereof shall be divided among the depositors, their executors, administrators or assigns in just proportion.

SECT. 3. Marshall Pierce, named herein, is authorized to call the first meeting of said corporation by giving seven days' notice in one of the papers published in said city of Saco or city of Biddeford, of the time and place of said meeting, at which meeting, and at every subsequent annual meeting, said corporation may elect by ballot any person or persons as members thereof, may choose such officers as may seem to them proper for their organization and government, who shall continue in office one year and until others are chosen and qualified in their stead; and the persons elected treasurer and secretary, before entering upon their official duties shall be sworn to the faithful performance thereof, and the treasurer shall also give bonds satisfactory to such corporation for the faithful discharge of his duties; *provided*, that the offices of treasurer and secretary may, if deemed advisable, be held by the same person, and be appointed by the trustees of said corporation, and shall hold said offices at the pleasure of the trustees.

SECT. 4. All deeds of conveyance, covenants and grants made in behalf of said corporation, shall be sealed with the corporate seal, and when made in pursuance of any vote of the corporation shall be valid and effectual to convey real or personal property or bind the corporation.

Deeds of conveyance.

SECT. 5. The annual meetings of this corporation shall be holden in the month of January, and at that meeting, and all other meetings it shall require seven members at least to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, and meetings may be directed at other times by the president or the corporation, and said corporation may provide in what manner their meetings shall be notified and called.

SECT. 6. The number of corporate members of the Saco Savings Bank shall not be less than ten nor more than thirty, and such corporation, at any legal meeting, may establish by-laws providing that members removing from the state or failing to attend the annual meetings for two successive years, unless excused by said corporation, shall cease to be members thereof.

SECT. 7. This act shall take effect when approved.
