CHAP. 45.**Chapter 45.**

Resolve authorizing the land agent to exchange lots numbered eighty-one and eighty-three in township number six, range five, in Aroostook county.

Land agent authorized to exchange public lots.

Resolved, That the land agent be, and is, hereby authorized to exchange public lots numbered eighty-one and eighty-three, township number six, range five, Aroostook county, for two other equally valuable lots in said township, allowing said public lots to revert to the state for settling purposes.

Approved February 26, 1869.

Chapter 46.

Resolve in favor of an appropriation on the road leading from Presque Isle to Ashland, in the county of Aroostook.

Road from Presque Isle to Ashland.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated for repairing the road leading from Presque Isle to Ashland, in the county of Aroostook, to be expended under the direction of the land agent.

Approved February 26, 1869.

Chapter 47.

Resolve in aid of building mills in township numbered six, range five, in the county of Aroostook.

In aid of building mills in township No. 6, R. 5.

Resolved, That the land agent be authorized and directed to convey by deed to the owners or their assigns of the mill in process of construction in township numbered six, range five, in the county of Aroostook, four lots of land in said township, when said mill is so far completed as to have one saw suitable for sawing boards, and a shingle machine in good and complete running order. Three additional lots when said owners or their assigns shall have completed and put in running order two pairs of mill stones, one pair of which shall be burrh stones, together with the necessary bolting and other apparatus pertaining to a well finished flouring mill; all of which shall be done to the satisfaction of the land agent.
