Chapter 86.

Resolve in aid of the Military and Naval Asylum at Bath, and the Bangor Orphans' Home.

Resolved, That there be paid out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise appropriated the sum of fifteen thousand dollars, to the trustees of the Bath Military and Naval Orphans' Asylum, to be used in aid of the said asylum subject to the approval of the board of guardians of indigent orphans of soldiers and seamen who lost their lives in the late war, on condition that the friends condition. and trustees of the said asylum shall first provide and appropriate the sum of five thousand dollars for the same purpose; and that Bangor Children's Home, in there shall also be paid to the said asylum and to the trustees of favor of the Bangor Children's Home at Bangor, out of the fund appropriated for the relief of indigent orphans of soldiers and seamen who lost their lives in the late war, a sum not exceeding one hundred dollars for each and every soldier's or seaman's orphan child now in the said institutions, or who shall be hereafter committed to their care by the board of guardians, for each year that such children shall remain in the same, and a proportionate sum for any part of a year, and the governor is hereby authorized to draw his warrant on the treasurer for such moneys as the case may require; provided, however, that the title to any real estate purchased by Proviso. the Bath Military and Naval Orphans' Asylum shall be vested in the state by a good and sufficient deed, to be made and executed by the grantor, and the said asylum shall have the free and perpetual use of the same so long as it shall be required for such use.

Chapter 87.

Resolve in favor of the state prison.

Resolved, That the sum of thirty thousand dollars is hereby State prison, in appropriated to cover the deficit between last year's appropriation

and the amount expended for building purposes, to complete the work already begun, to cover the deficit in current expenses of eighteen hundred sixty-eight, for building purposes, and to increase the working capital of the institution.

Chapter 88.

Resolve in favor of William M. Rust.

W. M. Rust, in favor of. Resolved, That the sum of twenty-five dollars be paid William M. Rust, member of the house of representatives, for expenses incurred during his late sickness.

Chapter 89.

Resolve in favor of the State College of Agriculture and the Mechanic Arts.

State Agricultural College, in favor Resolved, That the sum of twenty-eight thousand dollars be and hereby is appropriated in aid of the State College of Agriculture and the Mechanic Arts; provided that the inhabitants of the town of Orono shall make to said College of Agriculture and the Mechanic Arts an absolute conveyance of the same premises heretofore conveyed, subject only to the condition that in case the location of said college shall be changed from Orono, or be abandoned, or cease to be used for the purposes contemplated by the act establishing said college, then, and in such an event, the state shall refund to the inhabitants of Orono the sum originally paid for said lands, viz: eleven thousand dollars.

Chapter 90.

Resolve relative to the State Normal School at Farmington.

Normal school, appropriation for.

Purpose.

Resolved, That the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars is hereby appropriated out of any money in the treasury of the state, which has accrued from the sale of the four half townships of land appropriated for the support of normal schools by act of March eighteen hundred sixty-three, for the completion of the normal school buildings, and for necessary apparatus and charts for said
