Chapter 245.

Снар. 245.

Resolves in favor of the inhabitants of Riley plantation, in the county of Oxford.

Resolved, That the state treasurer pay to David F. Bennett, agent for the inhabitants of the plantation of Riley, in the county in favor of. of Oxford, for the use of said plantation, sixty-six and two-thirds dollars, being the sum to which said plantation would have been entitled, provided said plantation had made claim therefor in due form to the commission on equalization of municipal war debts.

Resolved. That resolve entitled "resolve in favor of the inhabitants of Riley plantation, in the county of Oxford," approved February fifteen, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, is hereby repealed.

Chapter 246.

Resolves in relation to the binding of the acts and resolves of this state.

Resolved, That the special or private acts and resolves passed Acts and resolves, since eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, shall constitute the eleventh volume of each, and that the public acts passed since eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, shall constitute a volume.

Resolved. That the secretary of state shall cause a title page. table of contents and general index, to be prepared for each volume; and that he cause the said acts and resolves to be sub- Distribution of. stantially bound and properly lettered for the use of the executive and legislative departments of the government.

Resolves in favor of a system of storm warnings in the State of Maine.
