COMPENSATION OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF KENNEBEC CO.

CHAP. 57.

annually, for the support of schools therein, a sum of money, exclusive of the income of any corporate school fund, or of any grant from the revenue or funds from the state, or of any voluntary donation, devise or bequest, or of any forfeiture accruing to the use of schools, not less than eighty cents for each inhabitant, according to the census of the state, by which representatives to the legislature were last apportioned, under penalty of forfeiting not less than twice, nor more than four times the amount of its deficiency; and no town which neglects to raise the amount of money required to be raised by this section, shall during the year in which such neglect occurs, receive any part of the state school fund, required to be apportioned to the several towns by the treasurer of state; provided, however, that all plantations shall be entitled to receive their part of the state school fund, when the inhabitants of such plantation shall have paid their part of all state and county taxes, and not otherwise.'

When to take effect. SECT. 2. This act shall take effect January first, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.

Chapter 57.

An act to fix the compensation of the county commissioners of Kennebeo county.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The pay of the county commissioners of Kennebec county shall be three dollars a day each for services while actually employed in official business, including the time necessarily spent in travelling and in making draughts, and shall receive for travel twelve cents a mile for the distance actually travelled.

SECT. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act are hereby repealed.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
