Chapter 12.

An act to incorporate the Trustees of the Wendell Institute and May School for Girls.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Corporators.

SECT. 1. Francis G. Butler, Timothy F. Belcher, Frederick V. Stewart, Alexander H. Abbott, Fred C. Perkins, A. H. S. Davis and C. C. Rounds, their associates and successors, are hereby incorporated into a body politic by the name of the Trustees of the Wendell Institute and May School for Girls, for the promotion of literature, science and morality.

Name.

Purpose.

Rights, &c.

SECT. 2. Said corporation are hereby vested with all the rights, privileges and immunities incident to similar corporations. They are authorized to use a common seal, to prosecute and defend suits at law, to make and establish by-laws and regulations for the management of their affairs, and the well ordering of said institute, not repugnant to the laws of this state, and to hold estate real and personal that they now possess, or may hereafter receive by gift, grant or otherwise, the yearly income of which shall not exceed the sum of two thousand dollars.

Seal.

By-laws.

May hold real and personal estate.

First meeting, how called.

SECT. 3. Francis G. Butler is hereby authorized to call the first meeting of said corporation by posting up notices in two or more public places in Farmington Center Village, ten days at least before the meeting of said corporation.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 13.

An act authorizing W. P. J. Cummings, Samuel B. Cummings, Noyes W. Crowley, and Nathaniel P. Chandler to build and maintain a fish weir in tide waters.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Authorized to build weir.

SECT. 1. W. P. J. Cummings, Samuel B. Cummings, Noyes W. Crowley, and Nathaniel P. Chandler, are hereby authorized to

build and maintain a fish weir in tide waters in the town of Addison, and within the limits herein described, as follows: beginning on the south side of the channel of Moose Pecca reach, immediately north of the northern Duck ledge, running westerly by the channel of said reach to the deep water running from said reach southerly, thence a south-easterly course to the eastern point of the Eastern Duck ledge, thence a northerly course to the point of beginning; *provided* said weir shall not obstruct navigation or interfere with the rights of others.

Location.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 14.

An act to make valid the doings of the Brewer Artillery Company in aid of a soldier's monument in Brewer.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The doings of the Brewer Artillery Company at a meeting held in Brewer, December eleven, eighteen hundred and seventy-one, are hereby made valid.

Certain doings made valid.

SECT. 2. Their agent, John M. Palmer, is hereby authorized to convey the gunhouse property, so called, and to appropriate the proceeds to the building of a soldier's monument in accordance with the vote of said meeting.

Gunhouse property, how appropriated.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

An act to incorporate the Richmond Factory Association.
